



MARCHING BAND PERFORMS ON NATIONAL STAGE




TRANSPARENT COMMUNICATIONS

As part of our Teaching with Technology initiative, every student in grades 4-12 was enrolled in Google Apps for Education, which encourages sharing and collaboration with fellow students and teachers.



CRITICAL THINKING THROUGH CODING

Eighty percent of Winfield Elementary students participated in at least one hour of coding in the classroom on a daily basis. Through a combination of hands-on robotic activities and computer simulations, students strengthened their critical thinking skills.



CREATING LEADERS AT WINFIELD CSD


